Movement

I happen to be writing this piece of article a week before Christmas in Advent season which for us has been a time of 'waiting' and 'preparing' for the coming of the Kingdom of God in the person of Jesus Christ. We have done this not just externally but also where it truly matters; in the very depths of our souls. So in some sense we have been looking inwards (inner searching) to find Christ and the kingdom within ourselves, for the more we search for this inner Kingdom the more we will know and appreciate its expression out there as well as the role we play in its expression.

By the time you are reading this article we will already be in the early days of the New Year 2018. This time of the year is a good opportunity for us to begin to look outward into the immediate future and become aware of how and where our plans and goals may fit into the expression of this Christ Kingdom.

One thing that caught my attention in this process of inner searching is the number of times I have moved from place to place in my short lifetime, and then choosing one way of life then another. I have questioned whether it has something to do with this Christ Kingdom. Some people may refer to this situation simply as 'unsettled life', and maybe it is, as opposed to being settled in one place. But this is not entirely what I am thinking about. I am broadly thinking of the time I have spent so far in my existence moving from the place where I am (not necessarily physical but also mentally and spiritually), or from goal to goal, or from this way of life to another until I discovered a kind of steadiness or a stability of mind and heart that I finally decided to embrace.....at least for now!

Then came those occasions and circumstances in life that made me to change my mind and begin to perceive my future differently, even following a new way without knowing completely where I was actually going. I really want to believe all these may have had something to do with the Kingdom....a 'sacred search', a quest of the Kingdom.

As I cast my inner eye into the future I am becoming more aware again of this fact of a 'sacred search' in all the plans and goals I have in mind for 2018. I am aware that in order for me to make sense of all what this future may hold for me I will have to take the risk of leaving behind the place where I am again, so that the yet unknown future will become more discernible and worthy of my choice in the hope that it will be part of the unfolding of the Christ Kingdom even as unclear and undefined this future may be at the moment. After all, unlike the idea of mathematics or music or any of the exact science, the idea of a perfect plan for my future life to fit into the Kingdom may not be realistic or even exist. It might be that I will have to see life in all its uncertainties as part of the mystery of the expression of the Kingdom.





WORSHIPPING TOGETHER



Over the last few years we have drawn together as a parish, worshipping together on particular Sunday's in the year, during Holy Week and at that great service when we greet both the resurrection and the dawn of Easter morning. We have experienced and appreciated the particular gifts and characters of our three churches and their congregations, and, perhaps even more significantly, by coming together even in these small ways have helped ourselves to understand that we are part of something much greater than the life of our individual churches and services.

The pattern, however, hasn't always worked easily: late November, with the feast of Christ the King, Patronal Festivals, and the rapid approach of Advent, can feel overloaded, and remembering which church is hosting which festival can tax even the compiler of the parish calendar.

At a recent PCC meeting we discussed ways of building on what we value in the times we worship together, while making the pattern of joint services rather simpler. The outcome was an agreement that each church should regularly host a certain service during the year, and that we should replace shared worship on the feast of Christ the King with a joint Harvest Festival.

For 2018, therefore, the pattern will be:


28 January Candlemas at St Andrew's

27 May Trinity at St Mary's

14 October Harvest Festival at St Catherine's

As before, the services will begin at 10.30 am, there will be no other morning service in the parish, and each will be followed by lunch (for details of the Candlemas fundraising lunch for Positive Life Kenya, see the poster in this magazine).

As before, lifts will be available between churches, and the clergy will be very willing to offer home communion for anyone unable to attend who wishes to receive the sacrament.



Our Holy Week services will continue to rotate between the churches: in 2018 Monday Compline and Maundy Thursday's service will be at St Andrew's, Tuesday and Good Friday at St Mary's, and Wednesday and the first Eucharist of Easter at St Catherine's. Put the dates in your diaries now!

ENGLISH FOR WOMEN



Way back in the summer Sarah Carter, (Wife of Canon Edward Carter, our diocesan chaplain) came to speak to us about "English for Women" as reported at the time in this magazine. Here is an update.

"English for Women" was started 2 years ago and was run by the cathedral to provide help with English speaking for a group of Afghan wives who had arrived in England with nothing.

Its aim was to aid long term integration of migrant and refugee families by providing a free drop-in centre offering English classes for women and a positive play environment for their pre-school children, it also raises awareness of British culture, nutrition and practical life skills. It is informal and women learn through conversation and so they grow in confidence. It also helps children as they are not kept off school to translate for their mothers if they need to go to the doctors etc.

It started with just 3 Afghan women and now has 40 women and their children, speaking 24 languages. This all takes place in the Y.M.C.A. premises in Chelmsford with a nursery plus 60 volunteers and is open 3 days a week. Volunteers must be English speaking women, not necessarily teachers ,they work to themes each week which are taught through conversation. They do receive safeguarding training.

"English for Women" is not a school or college but an informal drop-in centre for conversation and language practice. At the Chelmsford Diocesan Mothers' Union Council it was announced that the trustees had agreed to take on the project from 1st. January 2018. Members voted unanimously to set up a restricted fund for this project


