

# "Cone but not forgotten" or How I learned to be a priest



Shortly after we arrived in Wickford, the hard shoulder of the A130 was converted into a third lane. Ever since, that third lane has been coned off, of course! In the morning rush hour, its pristine tarmac is tantalising to those drivers unfortunate enough to be crawling to work in the other two lanes.

To my great amusement (given that I travel down that road at least three times a week) it looks as though the opening of the third lane has been carefully timed to coincide with our leaving the area!

The experience of keenly awaiting the opportunity to fly off down the third lane, is not entirely dissimilar to the final months of being a curate. Over the last three years I have been trained by you, by my clergy colleagues, and those I've met in the community. I have learned something of what it means to be a deacon, to be a priest, to be a chaplain, to be a curate, - and what it might mean to be a Priest-in-Charge. The road has been carefully prepared, the road surface looks inviting, I'm already familiar with the sign posts, and – frankly – I'm now itching for the cones to be removed!

Yet, of course, our zooming off into the new lane will mean leaving Wickford and Runwell behind. So, our excitement is tempered with real sadness. Sadness because our time in Wickford and Runwell has been one of deep contentment and joy - along with challenge, of course.

Thank you sincerely for the love and friendship you have shown Sian, Martha, James and me. It has been a wonderful privilege to work alongside you all in the service of the God of love. It has been a blessing to become part of the community of Wickford and Runwell.

We leave with many stories, many happy memories, many lasting friendships, and – most of all - a deeper appreciation of the grace of God. Grace which has reached us so powerfully: through you.

May God continue to bless you, protect you, and keep you always in his love.

MARRIED AT ST ANDREW'S




St Andrew's has a new role – as a wedding venue!

#### **CAP Money Course**

Christians Against poverty was founded in 1996 in Bradford by John Kirkby which he states he started with



a small donation and big faith! He believed God was calling him to sacrifice his career in finance and use his knowledge of the industry to help the poor.

This belief has grown from one man helping people in need to 624 church-based projects in the UK and has been replicated in Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

Some months ago, Margaret, Sian and I travelled to Brighton to complete the training. It focusses on money management and teaches budgeting skills and a simple cash-based system which they have proven works!

The facilitators delivering the training were certainly enthusiastic about how it has helped many people. What they have also particularly learned along the way is that the system works for anyone! Whatever the financial position the principles of the model can support those already in debt, those who may be experiencing financial hardship and difficulties as well as preventing money problems in the future by supporting individuals to be in control of their finances.

We have been privileged recently to have put into practice what we have learned with a small group of individuals at Brockfield House. The engagement and feedback were positive with participants stating that the model was clear and easy to follow and understand. It was great to see it at work and the immediate impact and benefits it could have as two of the participants were at the point of moving on to independent living.

This is, however, a model we are not only hoping to continue to deliver but to live by as well and play our small part in the Christians Against Poverty vision which is to bring freedom and good news to individuals in every community through 1,000 CAP projects by 2021.


